Saori is a unique style of weaving founded by Misao Jo in Japan. The SA of SAORI is the first syllable of the word SAI. SA means everything has its own individual dignity. And the ORI of SAORI means weaving. SAORI is a free-style hand weaving with no rules and restrictions, meaning there are no mistakes. Unexpected surprises become design elements. SAORI is the opposite of machine-made cloth. Every weaver has their own unique personality and every cloth has its own unique personality. On the SAORI website it says, "In SAORI, we do not weave only a cloth. We weave our true self."
